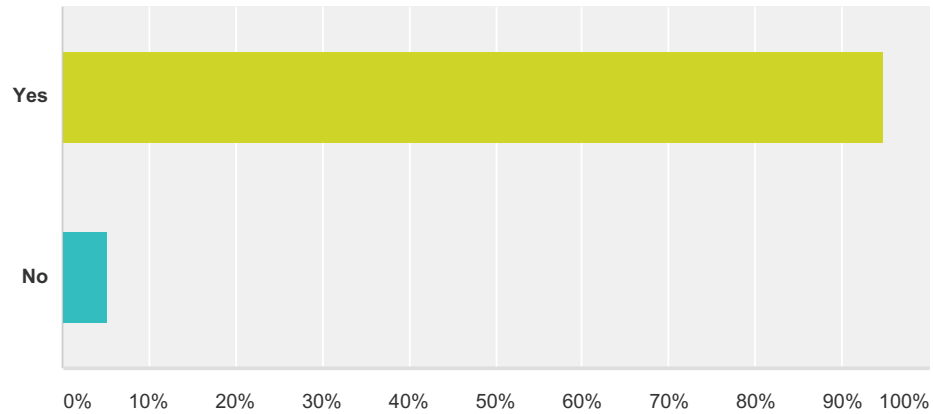


Q1 Do you think playwork needs a new body in the UK?

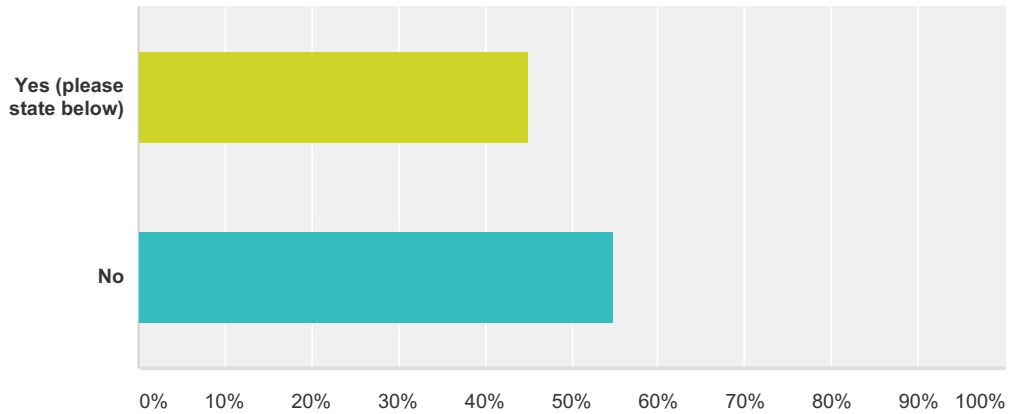

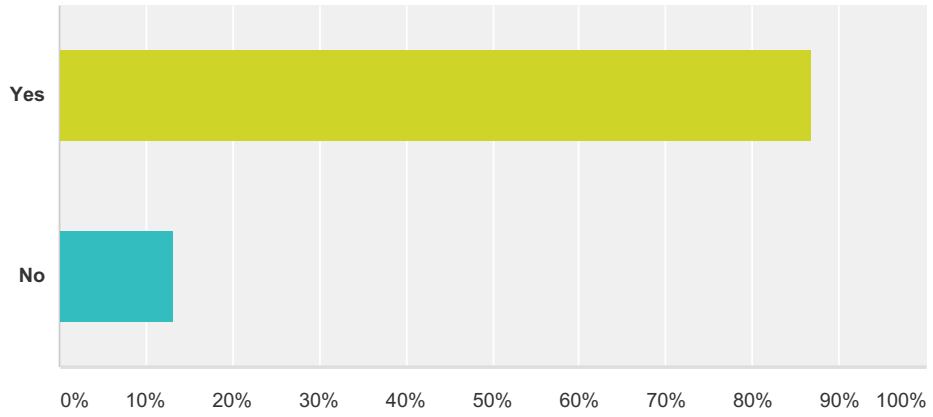

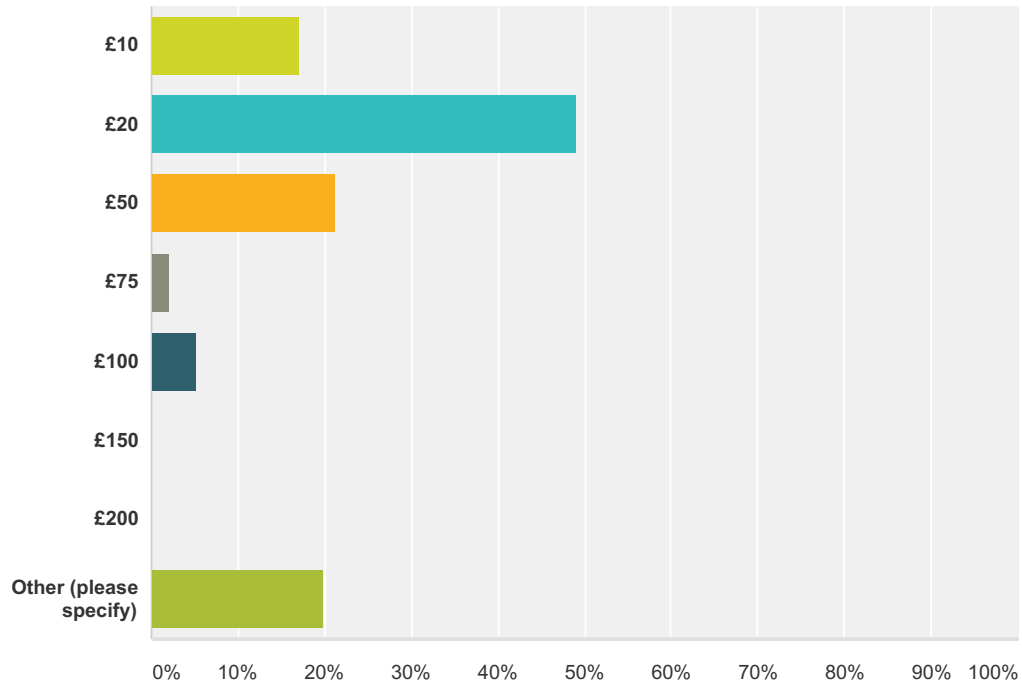

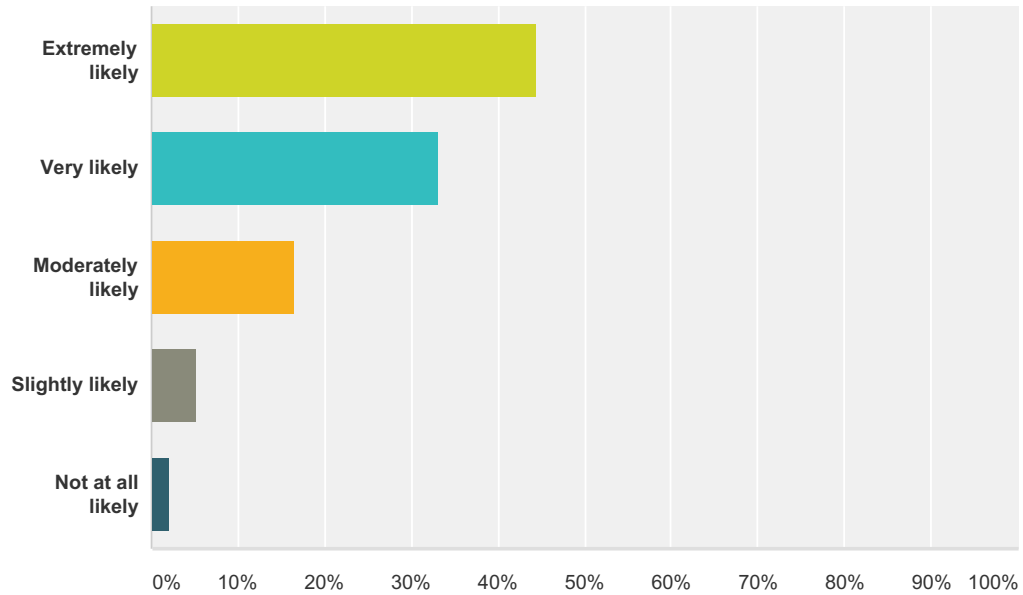

Q8 If membership of such a body was available today - along the lines described, offering the services you have identified at the membership fee you have indicated - how likely would you be to join it immediately?

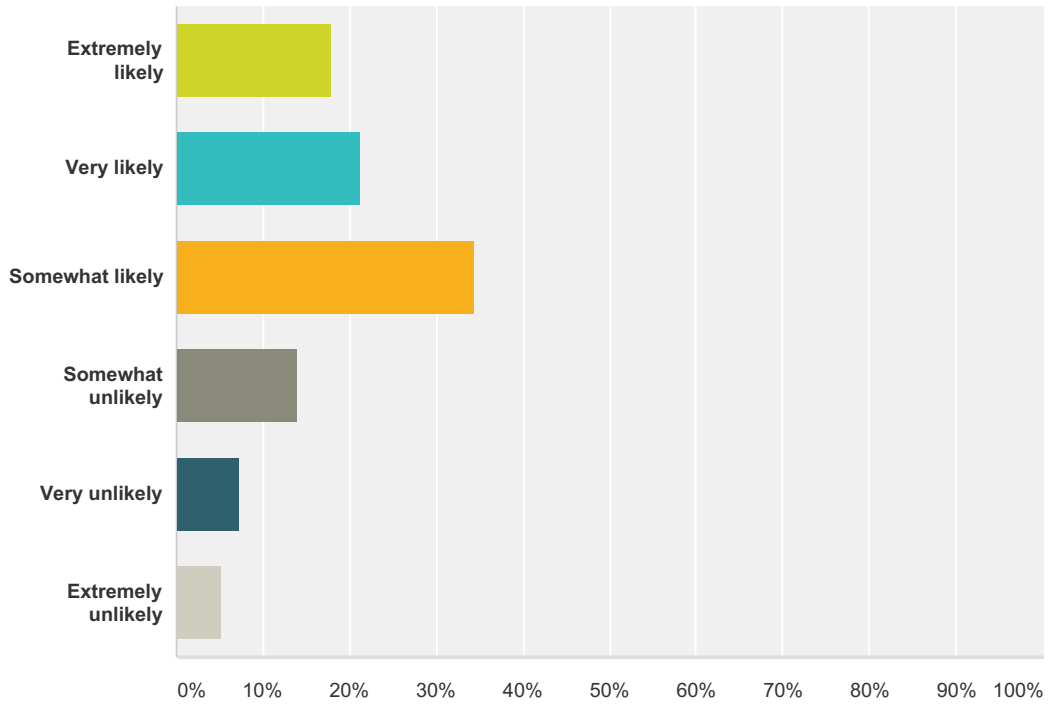

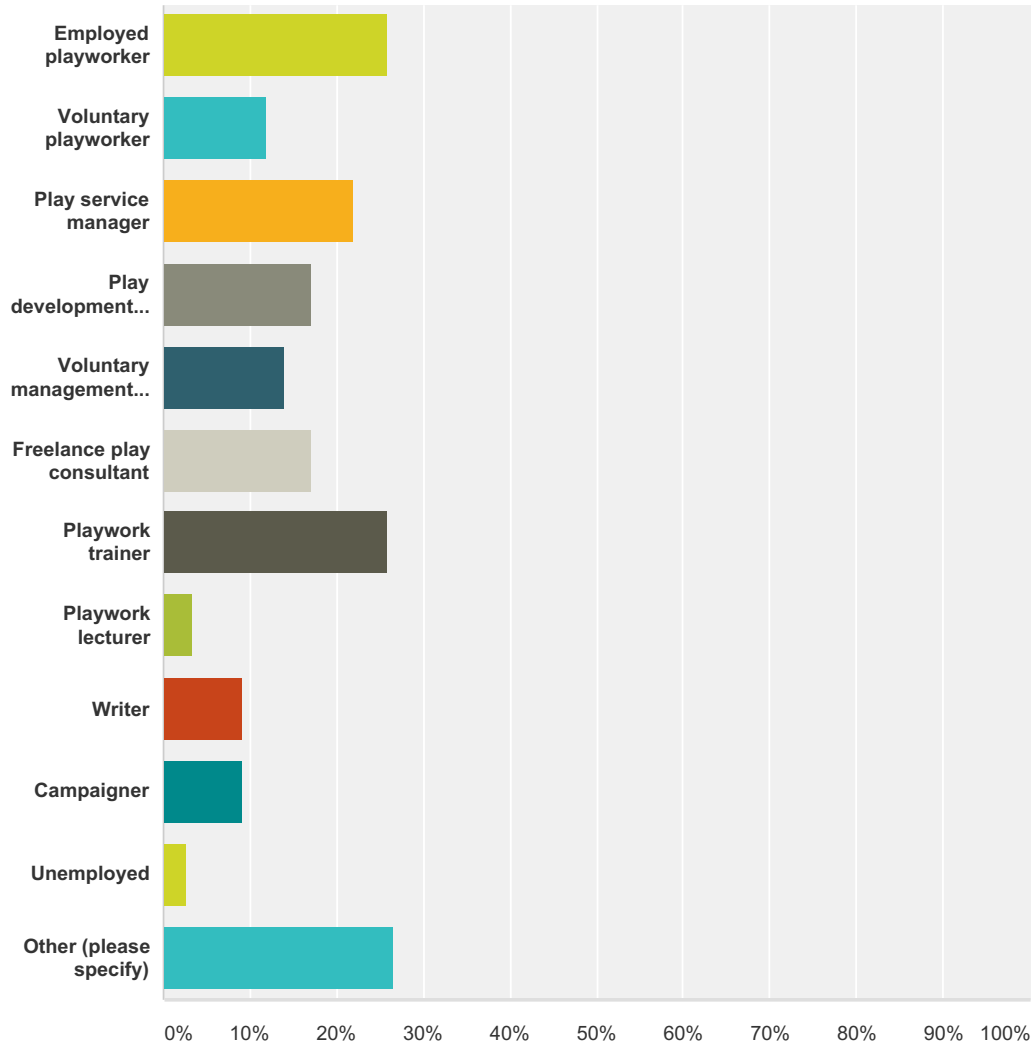
